PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

THE EPIPHANY OF This weekend we celebrate the *Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord*. With this weekend THE LORD and with Monday's celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we formally conclude the season of Christmas. Most of us are familiar with the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas." It certainly is a classic and heard often among the many other favorite carols at Christmas time. But not everybody thinks about the "real" twelve days of Christmas. In the Church, the Christmas season actually begins the day after Christmas and ends twelve days later. Christmas is not just for a day, but it is a "season". And so, this weekend, on the twelfth day of Christmas, this most wonderful time of year comes to a close with the ancient celebration of the Feast of the Epiphany.

In celebrating the Epiphany, we celebrate the revelation that Jesus was born as the Son of God and a Savior for all the nations. Today's gospel illustrates this revelation by the familiar story of the three wise men who traveled afar from the East to visit Jesus following His birth. They embarked on a journey of faith, following the great star of Bethlehem until they reached the manger where Jesus laid. They brought gifts that symbolized the revelation of His divinity: Gold, which associated Jesus as a king. Frankincense, which was often used in worship, and symbolized the holiness of Jesus and His priestly identity. And Myrrh, a perfume used for embalming, which symbolized that Christ would one day die for our sins.

As we start a new calendar year, it's a time of rejuvenation for many of us and maybe perhaps even some new resolutions. A chance for a new beginning. A chance to discover new things and perhaps make our own revelations (or discoveries) with regards to our relationship with God. As the wise men in today's gospel did, we too can continue to follow our faith throughout this coming year. The wise men had a revelation that the Son of God was coming, and they were not afraid to follow their hearts. Let us not be afraid to follow our hearts when we hear God's call in our own. May we, like them, seek to follow Him and in turn, reveal His presence in our world today.

I was truly edified by the ceremonies here at OLA throughout the Christmas season and the cooperation of so many people to make our Masses so beautiful and prayerful. I want to thank all of our staff and volunteers for all they did to decorate the church as well as our hall for our Christmas Masses. Everything looked beautiful! I also want to thank all of our liturgical ministers, especially our Choir under the direction of Anne Sprissler for the beautiful performance of music they provided prior to Midnight Mass as well as for the Mass itself. And finally, I want to thank all of you, my dear parishioners, for your generosity in this years' Christmas collection which reached \$15,284 It certainly is always a wonderful time of the year and I pray that the love of the Christ Child will remain in your hearts and homes throughout the coming New Year.

It is around this time of the year that we highlight and encourage participation in our Annual Parish Retreat for Men at Malvern Retreat House which traditionally occurs at the beginning of February.
