

# **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Friends.

This weekend, we celebrate the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel this weekend comes at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry early in the Gospel of St. Mark. Jesus has now moved to Capernaum, which is located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee and which would be His "home base" for most of His three-year ministry. This particular Gospel account occurred on the Sabbath (our Saturday), which the Jews observed as a day of rest and worship. As would be expected from a faithful Jew, Jesus went to the synagogue (the place of worship) that day. Jesus taught there with authority. The people listened to Him (alluding back to today's first reading) and "were astonished at his teaching." But Jesus astonished them even further with what happened next. A man with an "unclean spirit" came into the synagogue. The phrase "unclean spirit" means that this man was demon possessed. The demon identified Jesus as "the Holy One of God." In other words, the demon knew (likely even better than the observers at the time) that Jesus is God in the flesh. Jesus then proved this identity by authoritatively rebuking the demon. Simply by His words of rebuke, the demons fled. The man was freed from the control of the demon by the power of God. Jesus came into the world for this purpose: to drive evil out. We see here that He is more than capable of doing that. Jesus is God in the flesh, so He has authority over all things. He, therefore, can transform us and set us free from the sin that plagues us. Jesus wants to give us freedom in Him, but will we have the trust to listen to Him and obey His divine authority?

Looking ahead, on Friday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>, we will celebrate the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This day is also referred to as "Candlemas Day." It is the day that Jesus was presented in the Temple by His parents and was taken into the arms of Simeon who proclaimed Him to be a light to the world to dispel all sin and darkness. For this reason, candles are blessed on this day. We will have our usual morning Mass at OLA at 8 AM. I invite you to bring candles from your home to be blessed at the Mass. You can simply place them upon the table near the baptismal font. Along with them, we will also bless the candles that we will use at Mass throughout the year. Traditionally, this day concluded the season of Christmas. Please consider participating in this time-honored tradition that reminds us that as we use candles for our prayer and devotion, Jesus Christ is forever the light of the world.

We again highlight and encourage participation in our Annual Parish Retreat for Men at Malvern Retreat House during the first weekend of February — February 2–4. Soon Lent will be here! This year it begins rather early on February 14th (St. Valentine's Day). As is customary during the season of Lent our music for the Mass will be "simplified" to reflect the spirit of the season. For all the Sundays of Lent we will be chanting the Antiphons for both the Entrance and Communion processions. Likewise, we will incorporate into the Mass a few sung acclamations in Latin. This adjustment in music gives us an opportunity not only (in the case of the Antiphons) to sing the Liturgy itself as the Second Vatican Council intended but likewise, to utilize the universal language of Latin to show our solidarity with other cultures around the world. Over the next three weeks I will use this column to further explain these musical adaptations in the hopes that you can appreciate the diversity and richness they will bring. Usual hymns in the vernacular will still remain at the Presentation of the Gifts and at the end of Mass and worship aids will be provided for the participation of all. I look forward to sharing more information about this over the next few weeks and I am looking forward to a prayerful and spiritually uplifting Lenten season with all of you and your families.

I take this opportunity to thank all of those who have responded so generously to this year's *Annual Appeal*. As of this date we have received \$85,736. If you have not returned your contribution as of yet, I invite you to do so as it will help greatly with this year's important roofing project estimated to cost \$185,000.
