

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Third Sunday of Lent*. Our gospel tells the account of the Cleansing of the Temple. Jesus dramatically makes a whip and drives out the money changers, those selling animals to be sacrificed, and even the animals themselves. As Our Lord overturns the tables, He shouts that His Father's house should not be "a marketplace." This cleansing occurred during Passover, when the Temple was crowded with pilgrims from Israel and beyond. Therefore, we can imagine the great chaos. With His actions, Jesus was disrupting and even destroying the system that had been set in place for these many travelers to pay the temple tax and purchase animals for sacrifice. The reason that Jesus cleansed the Temple was because the activity there was focused not on worship, but instead on worldly things. By chasing everyone and everything from the Temple area, Jesus was clearing out all that distracted from reverence for God and set back in order the practice of right worship. During this season of Lent, we might consider how we could do the same. What in our lives is distracting us from our proper worship of the Lord?

Part of our daily routine should be time for prayer. It is fitting during Lent to fast from an activity, such as time spent on social media or watching television, to make more time for prayer. In this way, we turn our eyes toward the Lord and sanctify our daily routine. Today's gospel also brings to mind our worship of God on Sunday. We must always keep in mind how we keep holy the "rest" of our Sundays, which can easily get cluttered with unnecessary work and activities that pull us away from our families and our prayers. In addition to Mass, perhaps we can consider sanctifying our Sundays with reading Scripture or offering private prayers and devotions, or simply sitting still for a while in silence with the Lord. In this way, we can turn our eyes toward the Lord and truly call it the Lord's Day, making changes that will lead to an experience that is less cluttered and more focused on God. By baptism, we are made His temples. How is the Lord asking us to make our temples holy, to rearrange our schedules in order to cleanse our lives of worldly things? This Lent, may we rely on Christ's grace to overturn the distractions in our lives and turn more fully toward Him in true and sincere worship.

This_Sunday, March 3rd our own OLA Choir will present a musical offering called *The Lenten Sketches* composed by Joseph M. Martin. This hour-long work will provide us an opportunity to reflect (through music) on the last pivotal days of Christ's earthly ministry. It is my hope that you can come to hear our choir who have worked hard to provide this spiritually enriching event for our parish community during this holy season of Lent. The Lenten Sketches will take place at 4 PM in the church. I take this opportunity to thank our choir under the direction of Anne Sprissler for offering this special music to help us spiritually on our Lenten journey towards Easter.

You are invited to join us for Mary's Way of the Cross, sponsored by OLA's Walking With Purpose on Wed., March 6th at 7 PM in the church. This is a beautiful version of the Stations of the Cross as seen through the eyes of our Blessed Mother.

Next weekend Msgr. David Benz will be speaking at all of the weekend Masses on behalf of *Cross Catholic Outreach*. Cross Catholic Outreach is an international Catholic organization founded to create a meaningful link between parishes in America & the priests & nuns working overseas in the Caribbean, Africa, Asia & Central & South America. Msgr. Benz is a frequent guest here at OLA. Many of you have come to know him well. We look forward to seeing him once again & hearing about his current ministry to the poor.

Just as a reminder, our church will be open for Confessions & a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament from 7 PM – 8 PM every Tuesday evening during the season of Lent. Also, Stations of the Cross devotions are scheduled for each Friday in Lent at 7 PM. Please consider participating in these traditional Lenten practices & especially bringing your children to participate in them.

I encourage you once again (if you haven't done so already) to take home one of the purple cups available at the exits of the church. Each year, during the season of Lent, we take up our annual appeal called *"Change for Christ"*. This year, we are supporting Mother of Mercy House located in Kensington, Philadelphia. This is a wonderful cause & a special opportunity to teach ourselves and our children the need to make sacrifices for others and to recognize the face of Christ in those who are poor and needy.
