<u>Marriage</u>: Engaged couples must meet with the Pastor at least six months prior to the Wedding.


<u>Anointing of the Sick</u>: Holy Communion for the homebound or Sacrament of the Sick upon request. Anointing in preparation for surgery after Masses.



PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends.

in him should not This weekend, we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent also known as "Laetare" Sunday. It occurs at the very midpoint of Lent and derives its name from the first words of the Entrance Antiphon at Mass, "Lætare Jerusalem"—"Rejoice, O Jerusalem". On this Sunday, flowers at the altar are permitted, the organ may be played more frequently; and Rose-colored vestments may be worn instead of the strictly penitential purple. The contrast between this Sunday and the other Sundays of Lent encourages us to stay strong in our Lenten commitments for soon the joy of Easter will be here!

Our Gospel this weekend shows us the beautiful encounter between Jesus & Nicodemus. Nicodemus is a Pharisee. Keep in mind, at the time of Jesus, those in charge of the religious and social laws of the Jewish people were the Scribes and Pharisees. They had reduced belief in God to rules, laws and regulations. Anyone who could not keep these strict rules was not worthy of God and were generally kept out of the synagogue and the Temple such as the sick, the poor, the widows and tax collectors. According to the Pharisees, they were not worthy of God. But these were the very people that Jesus came to be with. These are the very people to whom Jesus came with the good news that God loved them and that the Kingdom of God belonged to them. Because of this, the Scribes and Pharisees were always looking for a way to undermine Jesus. They even said of him, Look this man even eats with sinners. Jesus in return was never afraid to challenge these religious leaders and He accused them of being hypocrites.

Nicodemus comes to see Jesus at night because he is afraid that someone might see him talking with Jesus. He would have had a very set and fixed idea of who God was. However, Jesus offers him a very different image of God. He reveals a much bigger sort of God than Nicodemus can even begin to imagine. The God of the Pharisees tended to be angry and judgmental. The God that Jesus offers is one who does not judge or condemn. The God of Jesus is our God who loves us, who does not punish us, but deeply wants a personal and intimate relationship with us. The God of Jesus is one who does not destroy us but lifts us up.

God loves each of us so much and so deeply that he sent Jesus so that we might have eternal life. God loves us so much and so passionately that he sent Jesus so that we may not be lost, but found. God sent us Jesus so that we will be saved, not condemned. Jesus comes to not only show us how to live but how to live life fully in the light. Jesus invited Nicodemus out of the dark and into the light. As we take another step on our Lenten journey, Jesus invites all of us to do the same!

Palmweaving is a time-honored tradition in our parish. All are invited to come to Assumption Hall to one of the palmweaving sessions (in person) that are scheduled for Sat., 3/16/2024 from 10 AM – 12 Noon and on Wed., 3/20/2024 from 6 PM – 8 PM. All woven palm will be used to adorn the altar for our Palm Sunday Masses on 3/23 & 3/24. Anyone who creates a woven palm is encouraged to please come back to the church after the 10 AM Palm Sunday Mass has concluded to pick up your palm. They are beautiful to place on the grave of a loved one or to have as a reminder in your home.

Just as a reminder, our church will be open for Confessions & a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament from 7 PM – 8 PM every Tuesday evening during the season of Lent. Also, Stations of the Cross devotions are scheduled for each Friday in Lent at 7 PM. Please consider participating in these traditional Lenten practices & especially bringing your children to participate in them.

I encourage you once again (if you haven't done so already) to take home one of the purple cups available at the exits of the church. Each year, during the season of Lent, we take up our annual appeal called "Change for Christ". This year, we are supporting Mother of Mercy House located in Kensington, Philadelphia. I invite you to visit their website: <u>https://motherofmercyhouse.org/</u> to learn more about them. This is a wonderful cause & a special opportunity to teach ourselves and our children the need to make sacrifices for others and to recognize the face of Christ in those who are poor and needy.

Once again, I am so grateful for your prayerful & financial support of our parish. May you and your families continue to have a fruitful and blessed Lent!
