PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the *Third Sunday of Easter*. We continue to celebrate these beautiful Easter days in preparation for Pentecost Sunday. These days focus on the appearances of our Lord to His disciples after the Resurrection. Imagine though if Jesus appeared to you. What if He showed you the wounds in His hands and feet and invited you to touch Him so as to believe. Would you believe? Most likely you would to a certain extent. It would be the beginning of an experience that could be life-changing, just as it was for these disciples. Our Lord's appearance to the disciples led to their transformation from men who were confused and doubtful to men who were filled

with joy and zeal. Eventually, they would go forth preaching about Jesus as witnesses to His death and Resurrection with courage and with a desire that all who heard them would turn to Jesus as their Savior.

In the first reading of today's Mass, Saint Peter is recorded as doing this very thing. After healing a crippled man at the gate of the Temple, a crowd gathered in amazement and Peter preached to them about Jesus. He concluded His sermon by saying, "God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."

Today, we are entrusted with the same mission given to our Lord's disciples, and we must preach with the same zeal, courage and conviction with which they preached. First, we must become as certain as they were about Jesus' triumph over sin and death. We must turn from all sin and believe that the fullness of life is found only in Christ Jesus. But then we must commit ourselves to the proclamation of this faith with every fiber of our being.

This weekend invites us then to consider how much we believe in Jesus as the Savior of the World. Though it might be tempting to think that having Jesus appear to us in person would help deepen our faith in Him, the truth is that the first disciples were not primarily convinced because of the physical appearances of Jesus. Rather, this gift came primarily through the spiritual touching of their minds. After appearing to the disciples physically, we read that Jesus "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." This was what convinced them more than anything—the spiritual gift of understanding. And that gift is offered to us today, just as it was to the first followers of Jesus.

Let us reflect then today, upon our own knowledge of Jesus and the transforming power of His Resurrection in our own lives. Within us, like the first disciples, we will then come to know and believe in the life, death and resurrection of Christ so that we can then go forth empowered to proclaim these truths to others we meet in our world today.

This Sunday we welcome Bishop Keith Chylinski to celebrate the 10 AM Mass. As many of you know, the Archdiocese of Philadelphia recently consecrated 3 new Auxiliary bishops this past March 7th. We are especially proud here at OLA as Bishop Keith is a "son" of our parish. Keith moved to OLA when he was in high school and was an active member singing in our choir for many years. Many of you at that time came to know him and love him. Bishop Keith will celebrate this Mass in Thanksgiving and it will be followed by a light reception in Assumption Hall. We are collecting donations in order to gift him with a full set of Mass vestments along with a matching Bishop's Mitre. Special envelopes are available in the vestibule of the church, and you may simply place your donation in the collection basket or drop it off at the Parish Office. We look forward to his pastoral visit to welcome him home on this historic occasion. We should all be honored that one of our own has been elevated to the Office of Bishop for our Archdiocese.

This weekend our Confirmation Candidates will be gathering for a retreat at St. Raphaela Retreat Center in Havertown, PA. I thank Sr. Rita Marian for coordinating this event and I thank all of our catechists and volunteers who make our PREP program so enriching to our young children. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers as they prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 4th. May God continue to bless them as they await the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Once again, I thank you for your generosity to OLA this Easter and I hope and pray that you and your families will continue to be blessed by the joy and peace of the Risen Christ.
