

Marriage: Engaged couples must meet with the Pastor at least six months prior to the Wedding.


Anointing of the Sick: Holy Communion for the homebound or Sacrament of the Sick upon request. Anointing in preparation for surgery after Masses.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time*. In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us two parables that reveal something of the mystery of the Kingdom of God. For Jesus, the Kingdom of God was not only in reference to the final glory of Heaven, but a present reality here and now. It was present when He healed the sick, forgave sinners, shared a table with sinners and proclaimed the Good News of God's unconditional love for all. Jesus intended that the Kingdom of God He inaugurated would continue to come into our world

through all of us, the community of believers that He gathered around Him during His earthly life. Saint Francis Xavier once said, **"Be big in small things."** That is to say, we are to do the small, ordinary tasks of life with a loving and generous heart. It also reminds us of the spirituality of Saint Therese of Lisieux, or her "little way" as she referred to it. In her quiet hidden life, she did her daily tasks with an extraordinary love for the Lord in her heart. Even though her world was in some ways very small, her "little way" had a tremendous impact on generations of believers throughout the world.

Jesus says that the Kingdom of God is like a tiny mustard seed which at the time of its sowing is the smallest of all the seeds and, yet, once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all. Jesus is suggesting that we can all sow little seeds of God's Kingdom. Just as the sowing of a small mustard seed grows into a large plant providing shelter for birds, so our own sowing of tiny seeds of love and hope can have great and unforeseen effects for good. Faithful, everyday choices to scatter the seed of the Lord's love can transform the world. Jesus is encouraging us to appreciate the value of our own small gestures of generosity & loving-kindness. He often drew attention to the significance of small gestures, of the mustard seeds of love. He said on one occasion that if anyone gives a cup of cold water to a thirsty person, they will not lose their reward and pointed out the greatness of the poor widow's contribution in the Temple.

In the first parable in today's gospel, Jesus seems to be saying that God can be working quietly, mysteriously, and yet powerfully, at the heart of the familiar. The farmer sows the seed and then does nothing for months, and, yet there is a wonderful process of growth going on all the time, until he is ready to reap the harvest. Jesus is saying that when we sow seeds of hope and love. More is always happening than we realize; God is at work there. The coming of God's Kingdom into the world is primarily God's work through, with and in us.

As Jesus' disciples we all have a role to play in building up God's Kingdom. Here and now for Him, we have to sow the seeds of Faith, Hope and Love. If we do that, if we are big in small things, God will multiply our efforts beyond our imagining. God will be working powerfully through our efforts, small as they may seem!

On this Father's Day weekend, we remember in a special way all of our dear fathers. We will have a special blessing at all the Masses this weekend for them and we will also remember and pray for them in the Prayers of the Faithful. Whether living or deceased, let us never forget our dear fathers and always seek to honor and remember them with a spirit of profound love and respect. Happy Father's Day!

This weekend, we conclude our Baby Bottle Drive for Mother's Home in Darby. I take this opportunity to thank all of you who participated and for bringing your contributions over these past few weeks. If you forgot to bring your baby bottle to Mass this weekend, you are more than welcome to drop it off at the Parish Office during the week. Thanks again for your generosity to such a great cause.

It was seven years ago this week that I arrived here as pastor of Our Lady of the Assumption. I just want to take this opportunity to thank all of you for making me feel so much at home here. Likewise, I offer my sincerest thanks as well to all the staff, volunteers, council members, etc. over these past years for helping me care for our parish and keep it vibrant, healthy and strong. Please continue to pray for me as your pastor and be assured of my prayers for you and your families.
