<u>Marriage</u>: Engaged couples must meet with the Pastor at least six months prior to the Wedding.


<u>Anointing of the Sick</u>: Holy Communion for the homebound or Sacrament of the Sick upon request. Anointing in preparation for surgery after Masses.

#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time*. In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus returns to His hometown of Nazareth. While there, He begins to preach and teach in the synagogue. Initially, all seems to be going well for Jesus as the Gospel tells us that the people were astonished as they heard Him speak. However, this doesn't last too long, and

suddenly they turn on Him saying; "Where did this man get all of this? Is He not (just) the carpenter, the Son of Mary?" And they would not accept Him. Perhaps this is because they could not believe that the great Messiah could come from such a familiar and humble place as one among their own. At the time of Jesus, the people were waiting and hoping for the Messiah. And, they had very set ideas about The Messiah and how He would establish His reign. They hoped that He would restore Israel to its former glory and then lead people triumphantly. However, Jesus would not be the kind of Messiah or leader they wanted. As one of their own, He challenges their assumptions about Him & their expectations of Him. And so, having turned on Him, they reject Him. While at first they were astonished at Jesus' words and wisdom, in the end, He winds up being amazed at their lack of faith.

Not everyone who met and heard Jesus liked what He said. Some did not even follow after Him. Similarly, with us, Jesus calls us by our name; He offers us the message He offered to those in the Gospel. How we respond to this invitation is up to us. We can either accept Jesus and His oftentimes challenging message or we can reject Him as those in the Gospel did. Like those in the Gospel, we have choices and decisions to make each and every day as we try our best to listen to, answer and decide to follow the path of Jesus. Each day, Jesus calls us by name to follow Him – how do we respond when we hear His call and invitation to us?

Soon, in little over a month, our Annual Italian Festival will be here. The Annual Festival will take place on August 11<sup>th</sup> with a special Feast Day Mass celebrated at 1:30 PM. Afterwards, the Festival will run from 3 PM until 7 PM with great food, live music, and fun & games for the kids. Along with our dedicated Festival committee, it is our hope to make this year's Festival even bigger and better than last year. Please spread the word and consider bringing a friend that day!

Leading up to that day, we will have our Triduum of Prayer on August 7th, 8th, and 9th. Fr. Anthony Albanese, Parochial Vicar of St. Laurence Parish in Upper Darby, PA will be our guest homilist each evening. After prayer, we will offer food & entertainment each night. Fr. Anthony was ordained just last year and he looks forward to being with us to celebrate these traditional days leading up to our great feast.
