

### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*. In the gospel, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech impediment. This is a story about Jesus' healing power. In it, we find clues about our understanding of "sacrament". As the story unfolds, we are struck by the physical means used to heal the man, the use of spittle & touch. The Church continues to celebrate the Sacraments using physical means. In the Sacrament of Baptism, water & oil are used to show the power of the Holy Spirit. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, we are anointed with holy oil on the forehead & hands. In the Eucharist, bread & wine become the Body & Blood of Christ. We are a "sacramental" people who believe that God's grace is given to us through these physical signs.

A rather interesting feature of today's gospel is the use of the word -Ephphatha. It is one of the few places in the gospels that preserve the very Aramaic words that our Lord would have spoken. It translates, "Be opened!" These are powerful words. Why are they powerful? They are powerful because they are more than just words. They are words that actually accomplish what they say. These words are spoken by Jesus after the deaf man is brought to Him with the request for healing. By saying the command "Be opened!" the deaf man's ears are opened and his speech impediment is removed. When Jesus speaks, His word has the power to change things. This is not only true in this particular story but it is also true in our lives. We might say that we are all deaf and struggle with a speech impediment in the sense that we do not always hear the voice of God and we do not always speak His word and words of charity. For that reason, we are reminded today that these words of Jesus must be spoken to us in order to heal us & transform us -"Ephphathal-Be opened!" What is it that you are not hearing properly? What is it God has been saying to you for a long time that you refuse to hear? What is it that you have allowed yourself to become deaf to? Perhaps this is a reminder to all of us that we need to set time aside from the business of our lives to quietly pray and allow our Lord to open the "ears" of our hearts so that we can hear all that He wishes to say to us. Once that happens, Jesus will also help us to speak and proclaim, like the man in the gospel, His words of truth and love. We are called to reflect upon just how "open" we are to hearing the voice of God and likewise, our own personal confidence and joy in proclaiming it to all we meet in our world today.

I hope you all had an enjoyable and restful Labor Day Weekend. The weather last Monday was beautiful and the perfect way to bring to a close the traditional summer months as we now prepare for another academic year. This past Thursday, we welcomed back our faculty and students to Assumption Academy with an opening Prayer Service. I take this opportunity to thank our dedicated Principal, Patty Welsh, the entire faculty & staff for all of their hard work & dedication for our children. We all look forward to another great year of fun and learning with our young students.

This weekend, we resume our celebration of the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the10 AM Mass each Sunday. Children between the ages of 2 - 8 are welcome to participate in these celebrations throughout the Fall & Spring. Likewise, parents are also welcome to attend. I thank Marge Seedor who coordinates this program as well as all our dedicated volunteers who joyfully bring the Word of God to life in the hearts of our young children.

Just as a reminder, every Tuesday evening from 7 PM - 8 PM, we continue to have our weekly Holy Hour led by our Deacon Paul Fisher. Hopefully, many of you will take the opportunity to pray with us on Tuesday nights and spend some time in adoration with our Lord. Even if you cannot commit to a full hour, you can always simply stop in and attend for a period of time that is most convenient for you.
