PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time*. We continue to read from the Gospel of Mark. You may recall that last week we heard Jesus chastise His

disciples for their argument about who among them was the greatest. Jesus taught them that the greatest among them will be those who serve the least ones.

In today's Gospel, the disciple, John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demons in Jesus' name. John's question might have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark's Gospel, Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples had been unable to heal. John's question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus' words to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers and they do not want to share the power of Jesus' name with others.

Today, the demon possession described in the Gospels might be seen as a form of mental illness, but the need for healing these syndromes was as real then as it is now. Exorcism was a common practice in first-century Palestine. Some people had the power to heal the symptoms of possession. One of the strategies used was to invoke the name of a person or figure who was believed to have the power to heal.

The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognized the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to His disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with others.

Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith when we see them in another person. It would be wrong, even sinful, to put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith in Jesus.

This Sunday, we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with our Level 7 PREP students at the 10 AM Mass. These young parishioners are candidates who are preparing to receive their Sacrament of Confirmation next year. They will be recognized at this Mass and given a special blessing. I would ask you to please keep them and their parents in your prayers at this time in their journey of faith as they prepare to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Last Thursday we welcomed the pilgrims of the Fr. Bill Atkinson Service Corps who walked in his honor from Villanova to our church. Upon their arrival, they were grateful to have our doors open to offer prayers in thanksgiving as well as a place to have a little food and conversation before returning home. Let us continue to pray for the cause of canonization of this wonderful Augustinian priest.

The beginning of the month of October brings to mind the feast of St. Francis of Assisi which falls on Friday, Oct. 4th. As is customary at this time of year, on Sat., Oct. 5th, we will celebrate our annual parish Blessing of Animals at 10 AM outside in the church Piazza. We welcome all of God's creatures to be blessed that day as we ask that through the intercession of St. Francis they will be protected from all harm and that we will always see them as truly a blessing from God and a source of great comfort. Likewise, we will bless animals in conjunction with an Opening Prayer Service for our little ones at Assumption Academy on Thursday, Oct.3rd. This is always a fun tradition to formally celebrate the opening of school along with God's creatures. May we always see in animals a reflection of the unconditional love of God.

The month of October is traditionally known as Respect Life Month. We will celebrate our Annual celebration of our Anointing of the Sick Mass. A clipboard has been placed in the vestibule of the church for those who would like to sign up to come to this Mass and be strengthened by this Sacrament of Healing. As a reminder, the Mass will take place on Saturday, Oct. 5th at 11 AM. A light Luncheon in Assumption Hall will immediately follow the Mass. For any further questions or details, you are welcome to call the Parish Office.

Lastly, the Annual Appeal letter will be arriving soon to your homes. I have included a Financial and Spiritual report as well as a report on our Outreach Ministry. I will keep you updated on our progress in the weeks and months ahead. I wish continued blessings upon all of you and your families and thank you wholeheartedly for your continued prayerful and financial support of our parish.
