PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the *Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time*. The gospel for this Sunday contains yet another parable for us to consider. A man had two sons. He asked the first son to go to into the field to work. He refused to do what was asked of him. But afterwards he had a change of heart and went to work as he was asked. When the father asked the second son to go to into the field, he said that he would do so, but he did the very opposite, he did not go to the field. Jesus then turned to the chief priest & the elders and asked them which one of the sons did his father's will. They all agreed; the first son. This parable as we can see then is about hypocrisy, that is, saying one thing & then doing another.

Just as it was for Jesus' followers in His day, this gospel is held up for you and I today so that we too can look truthfully at our own lives. It puts before us some very challenging questions. When I am asked to do something, do I say yes and then do the very opposite? How do I behave and act? Do the words I speak match what I do and how I treat others? These are difficult questions that Jesus to puts to each of us through this parable. The old saying "actions speak louder than words" is very appropriate for this Gospel. I can say that I am going to help another person who is need of my help and support, but if I don't actually do anything, what good have I done? And so, may we always have the courage to ask God to help us to put our faith into real concrete action. May we not be like the second son in the Gospel who said one thing and then went and did the very opposite.

The beginning of the month of October brings to mind the feast of St. Francis of Assisi which falls on Wed., Oct. 4th. As customary at this time of year, on Sat., Oct. 7th, we will celebrate our annual parish Blessing of Animals at 10 AM outside in the church Piazza. We welcome all of God's creatures to be blessed that day as we ask that through the intercession of St. Francis they will be protected from all harm and that we will always see them as truly a blessing from God and a source of great comfort. May we always see in them as a reflection of the unconditional love of God.

Next Sunday, Oct. 8th at the 10 AM Mass we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with our Level 3 PREP children. These young parishioners are preparing to receive their sacraments of Penance and First Holy Communion. They will be recognized at that Mass and given a special blessing and small gift as they prepare for these important sacramental celebrations in the Spring. Please keep them in your prayers at this time in their journey of faith.

Looking ahead, we will celebrate our annual celebration of **Forty Hours Devotion** beginning on Sunday, Oct. 15th at the 10 AM Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed upon the altar each day (Sunday, Monday and Tuesday) until 7 PM when we will gather to celebrate sung Evening Prayer and Benediction. This year, we welcome Msgr. Joseph Nicolo, Pastor Emeritus of Saint Helena Parish in Blue Bell, PA who will be our Homilist for these privileged days. I encourage you and your families to attend these evenings of devotion. I know that Msgr. Nicolo's words will be uplifting and inspirational. In addition, we will have sign-up sheets in the vestibule of the church for adorers to cover the daily periods of Adoration. Please check these sheets as you leave church and sign up if you can to spend some quiet time with the Lord present among us in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Last week we welcomed the pilgrims of the Fr. Bill Atkinson Service Corps who walked in his honor from Villanova to our church. Upon their arrival, they were grateful to have our doors open to offer prayers in thanksgiving as well as a place to have a little food and conversation before returning home. Let us continue to pray for the cause of canonization of this wonderful Augustinian priest.

Lastly, the Annual Appeal letter will be arriving soon to your homes. I have included a Financial and Spiritual report as well as a report on our Outreach Ministry. In addition, there is a census form that you are asked to complete. In my letter I have shared all the projects we were able to complete with last year's appeal and I have taken the opportunity with this year's letter to explain a major project that we need to undertake for the coming year. I ask you to prayerfully consider this year's special capital project and I will keep you updated on our progress in the weeks and months ahead.
