PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. For the past three Sundays, we have been hearing Mark's accounts of conversations between Iesus & His disciples. Iesus used these private intimate moments with them to teach His disciples in greater detail about the Kingdom of God. Now, beginning with today's Gospel, Jesus returns to Judea, Jewish territory, and resumes His public ministry. Immediately, the Pharisees approach Jesus to test Him. The Pharisees question Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce. Under specific conditions, divorce was an accepted practice among the Jewish people during the time of Iesus. It was regulated by the Law of Moses, as found in the Book of Deuteronomy. This law only permits that a husband may divorce his wife if he finds her to be indecent. This is the justification that the Pharisees reference when Jesus inquires about the commandment of Moses. In reply, Jesus describes the teaching of Moses as a concession made to God's original intention because of human stubbornness. Jesus then quotes from the Book of Genesis and counters that God's original intention was that men and women would become one flesh in marriage. At the end of today's Gospel, the people were bringing their children to Jesus, and again Jesus' disciples show that they just don't get it. Recall that in the Gospel for each of the past 2 Sundays, Jesus has taught His disciples the value and importance of these "little ones" in the Kingdom of God. Yet in today's Gospel, the disciples try to prevent people from bringing their children to Jesus. Jesus reprimands His disciples and welcomes these children. Again, Jesus offers these children as an example of the kind of complete trust and dependence upon God that ought to be the attitude of all of us as believers.

Next Sunday, Oct. 13th at the 10 AM Mass we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with our Level 3 PREP children. These young parishioners are preparing to receive their Sacraments of Penance and First Holy Communion. They will be formally recognized at that Mass and given a special blessing and small gift as they prepare for these important sacramental celebrations in the Spring. Please keep them in your prayers at this time in their journey of faith.

In just a few weeks, we will have our annual celebration of Forty Hours Devotion. Forty Hours will begin at the conclusion of the 10 AM Mass on Sunday, Oct. 20th and conclude on Tuesday evening, Oct. 22nd. Each evening (Sunday, Monday and Tuesday) we will have Evening Prayer & Benediction at 7 PM. We are blessed this year to have with us Fr. Andrew Auletta, a recently ordained priest, as our guest homilist for these 3 solemn days in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Auletta is currently stationed at St. Joseph's Parish in Downingtown, PA. I invite you and your families to come each evening to hear Fr. Auletta's inspiring words as we gather to adore Jesus in this wondrous Sacrament.

As customary, sign-up sheets will be de available at the back of church for those who would like to be "adorers" throughout these 3 days of solemn adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. May this year's Forty Hours be a blessing to all of us as we draw closer to the Lord and His love for us while praying for the many special intentions we hold in our hearts at this time of year.

In preparation for our annual celebration of Forty Hours Devotion, I will be offering a simple reflection the weekend prior on the origin and development of Eucharistic Adoration in the life of the Church, focusing on the more recent practice of Forty Hours Devotion as well as the theology & meaning of Eucharistic Processions. You are invited to the Sacred Heart Chapel on Saturday, Oct. 12th at 10 AM for this presentation. The talk will be for one hour with an opportunity for questions and answers.

As we enter into this month of October, I kindly ask you to keep a look out in the mail for a letter that will be coming from me regarding our *Parish Annual Appeal*. As you know, this Annual Appeal which normally takes place every Fall, is very important as it is a great help in sustaining our parish operations, especially in the area of important capital projects. Also, in this mailing you will find both a Financial Report as well as a Spiritual Report of our parish. This year's Appeal will be a follow up to last year's regarding the repair and replacement of our church and rectory roofs. As you may recall, last year I alerted you to the need to repair 6 beams in our church roof that were compromised. Along with these structural repairs was the need to also replace our aging roofs. As of this writing these repairs have been made and it is my hope that with this year's appeal, we can finance this major project without having to draw from our principal savings. I thank you in advance for your participation in this years' Annual Appeal and for your continued generosity to our parish.
