PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. The first reading and the Gospel this Sunday both use the image of the vineyard to speak to us about the patience and generosity of God. Jesus tells the chief priests and the elders a parable once again relating to a vineyard. In the Gospel, the owner of the vineyard sends workers into his vineyard to collect the harvest.

However, these poor servants do not receive a positive welcome. They are attacked and beaten. The owner then sends more workers into the vineyard. Sadly these workers are treated in much the same way. Lastly, the owner decides to send his son in the hope and belief that they will treat him with respect. But his hope is in vain; they kill his son. It comes as no surprise to us that the owner of the vineyard represents God and His Son is Jesus Christ. Also very clear in the parable is that those who killed the servants and the owner's son are the Scribes, Pharisees and the elders among the people. Imagine their shock and anger when they heard this story. They would have loved nothing better than to lay their hands on Jesus right then and there and do away with Him. In doing so, they would vindicate the truth of the parable; and in fact, they will not have long to wait before they actually plot to do away with Jesus permanently.

But this, like all the parables, is held up to us today, so that we, in some way, can see ourselves in it and thus learn from it. Through the life, mission, death and resurrection of Jesus, God offers the chance to reap an endlessly abundant harvest of love, mercy and forgiveness. These gifts are offered to us freely out of love. Like those in the Gospel, we have to choose freely whether to accept or decline God's generous offer. We are the tenants today and God has certain expectations of us. God looks to us to produce the fruits of love, mercy, compassion and the values of the Kingdom of God. The burning question from this parable to us today is simple but challenging; what sort of fruits and harvest are we producing in the vineyard of our world today though our ordinary daily lives as followers of Jesus?

This Sunday we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with our Level 3 PREP children at the 10 AM Mass. These young parishioners are beginning to prepare to receive their Sacraments of both Penance and First Holy Communion in the Spring. They will be recognized at this Mass and given a special blessing. I would ask you to please keep them and their parents in your prayers at this time in their journey of faith.

Likewise, this Sunday we celebrate "Deacon Sunday," a national day set aside on the 2nd Sunday of October to inspire vocations to the diaconate and affirm deacons & their families. And so, on this Sunday, I take this opportunity to offer my heartfelt thanks to our own Deacon Paul Fisher for his "yes" to God in service to our parish community as well as the local church here in Philadelphia. May God continue to bless Deacon Paul and his wife, Maria this day and always.

Next week, we will celebrate our annual celebration of Forty Hours Devotion beginning on Sunday, Oct.15th at the 10 AM Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed upon the altar each day (Sunday, Monday and Tuesday) until 7 PM when we will gather to celebrate sung Evening Prayer and Benediction. This year, we welcome Msgr. Joseph Nicolo, Pastor Emeritus of Saint Helena Parish in Blue Bell, PA who will be our Homilist for these privileged days. During this period of Eucharistic Revival, I encourage you and your families to attend these special evenings of devotion. Sign-up sheets are in the vestibule of the church for adorers to cover the daily periods of Adoration. These blessed days are a special time for all of us to come before the Presence of the Lord and rest in Him.

Now that the month of October (Respect Life Month) is here, we look ahead to the Annual celebration of our Anointing of the Sick Mass. This weekend, a clipboard will be placed in the vestibule of the church for those who would like to sign up to come to this Mass and be strengthened by this Sacrament of Healing. The Mass will take place on Saturday, October 28th at 11 AM. A light Luncheon in Assumption Hall will immediately follow the Mass. For any further questions or details, please call the Parish Office.

Finally, a reminder that the Annual Appeal letter has been mailed out to all of our registered parishioners. If you have not received it, you should receive it soon. I would ask you to please take the time to carefully read it. I thank you in advance for your much needed prayerful and financial support.
