

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time*. In this weekend's Gospel, we see the growth in Jesus' popularity by the large crowd that now follows him as he makes his journey to Jerusalem. Jesus' reputation as a healer has spread among the people. When the blind man, Bartimaeus, hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, he calls out to him, asking for his pity.



When Bartimaeus calls out to Jesus, the crowd around him tries to silence him. Yet Bartimaeus persists, calling out more loudly and with greater urgency. He will not be silenced or deterred from getting Jesus' attention. When Jesus restores Bartimaeus's sight, no elaborate action is required. Jesus simply says that Bartimaeus's faith has saved him. Once his sight has been restored, Bartimaeus follows Jesus on his way to Jerusalem.

In Mark's Gospel, Bartimaeus is the last disciple called by Jesus before he enters Jerusalem. Bartimaeus hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, but he calls out to Jesus using words of faith—"Son of David." Many in Jesus' time believed that the anticipated Jewish Messiah would be a descendent of King David. Bartimaeus's words prepare us for the final episodes of Mark's Gospel, which begins with Jesus' preparation for the Passover and his triumphant entry into Jerusalem. As Mark has shown us in our readings over the past few Sundays, however, Jesus will be the Messiah in a way that will be difficult for many to accept. Jesus will show himself to be the Messiah through his suffering and death.

Next Saturday, Nov. 2^{nd} we are looking forward to having our Annual Christmas Bazaar sponsored by the Ladies of Our Lady of the Assumption (LOLA). We invite you and your families to attend during the hours of 9 AM - 3 PM. There will be Craft & Vendor Tables, a White Elephant Table, beautiful Gift Baskets for Silent Auction, onsite Food Trucks, and a visit from Santa and his Reindeer from 11 AM - 2 PM. We look forward to seeing you all there!

On Sunday, Nov. 3rd the Knights of Columbus will be hosting their Semi-Annual Pancake Breakfast after the Masses. As is customary, there is no charge for the food, however, a free will offering will be welcomed. Please take this opportunity to stop in with your family & friends to share good food & conversation.
