PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time*. When I was a young child, there was a game that I often played with friends at school. It was called "Follow the Leader." It was a simple enough game. One person was chosen to be the "leader". Whatever the leader did or said, everyone else copied. For example, if the leader clapped their hands or jumped on one foot, everyone else did the same. If the leader counted from one to five, everyone else said the same thing. You were out of the game if you failed to do or say what the leader did or said.

Our Gospel this Sunday is about leaders. It is about what they say and what they do. It is about what sort of example they are for the people they are trying to lead and guide. At the time of Jesus, the religious leaders of the Jewish people were the Scribe and Pharisees. In front of the people gathered, Jesus makes a very public condemnation and criticism of them. Jesus clearly says for everyone to hear, "do not follow their example, for they preach but they do not practice." Strong words indeed. The Pharisees knew the Law of Moses. They told the people that they had to follow these rules in every detail in their daily lives. They asked the people to do this but were unable to do it themselves. They knew the Law very well; what they lacked was mercy, compassion and tenderness of heart. Their actions did not match their words. They made life difficult for people but would not lift a finger to help them or ease their suffering. They expected others to follow the law and to be perfect, but they themselves were far from perfect.

God does not expect us to be perfect. However, we are asked to be genuine, honest and authentic with ourselves, others and God. Last week when asked by the Pharisees what the greatest commandment was, Jesus replied, "Love God with all your heart, soul and mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." This is the heart of the Jewish Law, and it is at the heart of Jesus' message to us today. We are called to "follow our leader" Jesus, who came to serve and not to be served. This is the example we are asked to follow and strive to live by.

The month of November brings with it sentiments of remembering the Souls of the Faithful Departed. This Sunday, we will celebrate our annual Mass of Remembrance at the 10 AM Mass remembering all our loved ones who have died within the past year. The names of those who have died will be named during the Prayer of the Faithful at Mass and personalized candles will burn at our Lady's altar which will in turn be given to our families to take home with them. This is a wonderful tradition here at OLA and one that always reminds us to never forget those who have died and those who still mourn for them. Let us remember them and pray for these souls and their families on this weekend for the gift of hope, consolation and peace.

Once again, we have enshrined in the back of the church a *Book of Remembrance* to inscribe the names of the dead so that we might remember and pray for all of our beloved deceased. In addition, a votive candle, placed next to it, will burn continuously throughout the entire month of November as a beautiful reminder to us of their memory and the gift of faith and hope that we share in the resurrection of our Lord. Please take the time to inscribe the names of your loved ones in this book.

This weekend, the Knights of Columbus will be hosting their Annual Pancake Breakfast after all the Masses on Sunday. Please take this opportunity to stop in to share good food & conversation. And once again a big "thank you" to the Knights for providing this opportunity for us to gather together as a family of faith.

Our parish Annual Appeal which began last month continues. As you know, this years' appeal is especially important as we need to repair four major support beams in our church roof that have separated and have now compromised the building. Because of its scope and urgency, this is our only designated project for this year. Our general contractor has advised us to complete this project no later than the end of next year. We are planning on doing so this coming Spring along with replacing the old roofs of both the church and rectory. As I mentioned in my appeal letter, the total estimate of this project is \$185,000. As of this writing, we have received \$24,365 in donations. I thank all those who have already generously contributed, and I encourage those who have not done so as of yet, to prayerfully consider making a sacrificial gift to help repair our beautiful church.
