#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the *Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*. We all know the joy of getting a nicely wrapped gift whether for our birthday or at Christmas. We eagerly open and unwrap the gift that has been kindly given to us. We always thank the

person who gave it to us and we use it. But think how the person who gave us the gift would feel if we didn't open it and instead simply put it away somewhere leaving it sit unopened. This is the situation that we are presented with in the Gospel reading this weekend.

Like last Sunday, this Gospel puts before us again the message of "waiting" and asks how we are waiting. A rich man, before he leaves for a business trip, calls three of his servants and gives them each a sum of money. He gives them money according to the abilities that he sees in each of them. Notice how he simply gives them the money. He doesn't tell them what to do with it or how to invest it. He trusts them enough to let them decide how best to use what they have been given. So, the first two servants invest their money and so double the amount given. But the third servant, for whatever reason, simply buries his money in the ground. When the man returns, he calls in his servants and asks them to account for the money he gave them.

We have all been given gifts and talents by God. The important thing is not "what" I have been given, but "how" I use what God has given to me. Our talents are not just for ourselves; they are meant to be used to build up the Kingdom of God. Just think of the trust God has in each of us and the risk he takes with us. Liturgically, at this time of year we are waiting for the Lord to return. In the meantime, we can't simply sit, wait, and do nothing. We are to live our daily lives in such a way that we use all the many gifts and talents God has given each of us. In the Gospel, the man not only gave his servants money, but he also trusted them with a big responsibility. Jesus has given each of us the same responsibility. Through our ordinary lives and by using our gifts and talents, we are to show that we too are faithful servants.

May we choose the path of faithfulness and fruitfulness which leads to a future of true happiness and a share in God's joy. May God say to each of us in the end, "Well done, good and faithful servant".

This coming Thursday will be Thanksgiving Day. As we commemorate this beloved and traditional holiday, we will offer our annual Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9 AM. As customary, you are most welcome to bring any food that will be used at your table at home to be blessed at this Mass. Likewise, we will be distributing blessed bread that you can take home with you. In addition, a Cornucopia will be displayed in the church and following Mass, all will be invited to come forward and take something home to share with your family. In all of these simple gestures, we show forth an intimate connection between the "parish church" and your home, the "domestic church." I hope and pray that with whatever plans you have made for Thanksgiving this year, your day will be truly special and blessed!

On Monday, Nov. 20th at 5 PM we will celebrate our Thanksgiving Prayer Service with our PREP students in church and likewise on Tuesday we will gather at 9:30AM with our students at Assumption Academy to give thanks to God for the many blessings received throughout the year. Please keep all of our students in your prayers as we thank God at this time of year and ask for His continued blessings upon them and their families.

We have placed our OLA Giving Trees in both vestibules of the Church. We encourage you to take tags home with you to remember the poor and needy at this special time of year. As we do every year, we are once again collecting for the PREP families in need at St. Patrick's Parish in Norristown, PA.
